The 103<sup>rd</sup> Maverick Battalion commissioned its final cadet on 12 August 2006, 2LT Wyatt A. Britten, the cadet Battalion Commander. We commissioned 20 new second lieutenants during the past year, exceeding our assigned mission from the U.S. Army Cadet Command by six lieutenants.

The 104th Maverick Battalion stood up officially on 7 September 2006 during the Activation Ceremony in front of College Hall. Cadet/Lieutenant Colonel Leilani A. Kikugawa assumed the duties as the Maverick Battalion Commander. She is a nursing student who has maintained a 3.8 GPA. Her performance at Warrior Forge this past summer included an overall evaluation of Excellent, 300 on the record APFT, and earned her the Recondo Badge.

when do you like your nome Air Conditioner to be replaced? At first blush, most of us would say, "Never—there is not ever a good time." Mike Saltarelli picked September 11, 2001 as a good time. Good thing, as he was at home when the jet crashed into his office at the Pentagon. In his own words, here is his story:

"The plane passed right thru our head office, taking the DCSPER, his SGM, and many others in its path. My office was trashed, we had a few burn victims but no casualties. But like I said, I had scheduled leave that day to get a new AC unit installed at my house. The guys had just started working, I brought them out sodas and a boom box so they would stay happy and do a good job. They came in after a while and asked if we could turn on the TV since they heard on the radio that a plane had crashed into one of the Twin Towers in NY. We had the TV on for about a minute when the second plane hit the second tower and the reports started coming in of the Pentagon attack. I was in shock watching it all when my mom called, frantic because she couldn't get thru at my office number. I knew one guy pretty well, was posthumously promoted, and I recalled conversations with him - he was one of those people that worked your name into every other sentence, which really got on my nerves. No need to worry about that anymore. Many heroes that day, many others escaped with terrible memories, some not willing to return back to the Pentagon after it was rebuilt. I wonder why I'm still here, what

For the fall 2006 semester we were very fortunate. We originally were authorized only two four-year scholarships and five three-year scholarships. By time the dust settled we ended up with seven high school four-year scholarships, two four-year nursing scholarships, one four-year Green to Gold scholarship, two three-year Green to Gold scholarships, one two-year Green to Gold scholarship, and two two-year LTC scholarships.

We added over 50 new faces to the program this fall. This should be a great year for the Maverick Battalion. We have some new initiatives to continue the growth of the Corps. We have started giving a monthly Green to Gold presentation at Fort Hood and will also be doing this at Fort Sill to attract some of the prior service and Green to Gold soldiers to our program. Accordingly, we must drop our designation as the Cadet Corps Alumni Chapter and become an organization affiliated with the Military Science Department. Your Executive Committee did not want to change our acronym of "CCAC". Our consensus was to change our title to the Cadet Corps Alumni Council. We will no longer be accountable to the Alumni Association, but be assured that we will continue to support them and the university. We will now be an advisory group with a mission to support the Corps of Cadets.

We revised the Chapter by-laws to Council by-laws by making only a few changes. You'll get a chance to review the new by-laws and to offer your comments and/or approval. Copies will be sent to you with this year's Hall of Honor information. I ask that you carefully review them and respond promptly. Likewise, as we propose to incorporate other changes in the organization, we will keep you up to date.

Your Executive Committee thinks that this is a good move for us. We have enjoyed the support of the Alumni Association over the past years but feel it is time for us to be out on our own. What will the change mean? Well, here are just a few of the more significant changes:

- 1. We will no longer e accountable to the UTA Alumni Association.
- 2. We will have direct control of our funds and will not have to go thru the Alumni Association to access our funds.
- 3. We will no longer receive financial support as a chapter from the Alumni Association. Although this amount has been minimal, it was very important during the initial years of our organization. We feel that as our membership grows, we will be financially sound.
- 4. It allows us to be in a better position to support the Corps of Cadets without having to answer to the Alumni Association.

We can take pride in the fact that we are one of the largest alumni groups on campus. We are still growing and hope to significantly increase our membership over the next year. We need your support and help! Recruiting new members and building up our scholarship fund are vital to our future success. Today the UTA Corps of Cadets (The Maverick Battalion) has the second largest Army ROTC program in the state of Texas and ranks in the top 10% nationally. With our help they can do even better.

rior Forge. All 16 successfully passed Warrior Forge and exceeded the Brigade, Region, and Cadet Command averages in overall excellent evaluations, Land Navigation, and Recondo Badges. Our APFT average was 260, just short of the Warrior Forge average of 263. We plan to commission 20 second lieutenants from the 104<sup>th</sup> Maverick Battalion.

At our first Leadership Lab on 31 August 2006, I continued to highlight the importance of maintaining a high GPA, being physical fit and participating in cadet organizations. Our cadet organizations include the Sam Houston Rifles, Carlisle Cannons, Ranger Challenge Team, Color Guard and "I am a Maverick".

This past spring we acquired a second 75mm pack howitzer. We no longer have to explain why we called them the Carlisle Cannons when there was only one cannon. Over the summer we took them both to Fort Hood to get them fully serviced and ready for the upcoming school year. We're still looking at replacing some of the other cannons that were given away in earlier years.

Some key events this fall include Combat Water Survival Training (7 Sep), Land Navigation Training (14 & 21 Sep), Individual and Squad Movement Techniques (28 Sep), First Aid (5 Oct), Battle Drills (12 Oct), Ranger Challenge Competition at Camp Bullis (13-15 Oct), Alumni Gala (14 Oct), Fall FTX at Fort Hood (27-29 Oct), Squad Tactics (9, 16, & 30 Nov), Christmas Party (7 Dec).

Once again I am honored to be the Professor of Military Science at UTA. I look forward to seeing everyone during the new school year. I will continue to maintain a close relationship with Cadet Corps Alumni Chapter. **Go Mavericks!**
