

George Barnhart (Commander, Sam Houston Rifles, 71-72)—George passed away 29 May following a short battle with lung cancer. George may not have seen combat, but he was in a fire fight every day. We all know how much the Jodies shape your life...but this tribute from one of his men in the Benbrook Fire Department explains it best:

Captain George Barnhart of the Benbrook Fire Department was in the first paramedic class in Tarrant County let alone in the nation, back in the 1970's. He would tell us stories of literally "making it up as they went" bouncing down the streets of Ft. Worth, Texas in the back of an ambulance. Captain Barnhart has created and forgotten more about pre-hospital medicine than anyone I've ever met or heard of. His paramedic class had to go to Orange County in California just to do clinical rotations because there weren't any ambulances in north Texas yet. To this day I quote Captain Barnhart at least half a dozen times in every single class I teach. He made sure you that you knew your stuff as an EMT or Paramedic. It wasn't unlike him to pull up to the patient's house, put it in park and sit there and wait for you to tell him which hospital you wanted to go to. That was his way of breaking-in rookie EMT/Paramedics. You for darn sure didn't sit at his dinner table at the fire house with your hat on. - Caleb Causey
